PACE summer session highlights: alleged secret detentions, freedom of expression and respect for religious beliefs

Strasbourg, 20.06.2006 – Debates on alleged secret detentions and unlawful inter-state transfers in Europe, as well as on the balance between freedom of expression and respect for religious beliefs – with the participation of Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdoğan – are among highlights of the summer plenary session of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE), which takes place in Strasbourg from 26 to 30 June 2006.

On the morning of Tuesday 27 June Dick Marty (Switzerland, ALDE) will present his report on "alleged secret detentions and unlawful inter-state transfers of detainees involving Council of Europe member states". Vice-President of the European Commission responsible for Justice, Freedom and Security Franco Frattini and the European Parliament's rapporteur on this subject, Giovanni Claudio Fava, will take part in the debate.

The President of the Council of the Russian Federation Sergey Mironov will address the Assembly on Wednesday 28 June and Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Alexander Grushko will present the Communication from the Committee of Ministers to the Assembly the following day.

There have been requests for urgent debates on the consequences of the referendum in Montenegro and on constitutional reform in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Other subjects for discussion include the position of the Assembly as regards Council of Europe member and observer states which have not abolished the death penalty, the human rights of irregular migrants – with the participation of Morocco's Minister-Delegate in charge of Moroccans living abroad Nouzha Chekrouni – and follow-up to the earlier resolution on the challenge of credentials of the parliamentary delegation of Azerbaijan.

The parliamentarians will also discuss domestic violence against women, ahead of the launch of a three-year Council of Europe campaign on this theme, with the participation of the UN Special Rapporteur on violence against women Yakin Ertürk.

Jean Lemierre, President of the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, will take part in the Assembly's annual debate on the contribution of the EBRD to economic development in central and eastern Europe.
