Congress debate on the launch of the European Week for Local Democracy and a Charter on regional democracy

Strasbourg, 01.06.2007 - On the occasion of the Plenary Session of the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities of the Council of Europe, Ana Isabel Leiva Diez, Spanish Secretary of State of Territorial Cooperation, stressed that the revival of European democracy demands the greatest effort possible to integrate citizens into public life.

"Participatory democracy is not an alternative to representative democracy, quite the opposite – they both mutually reinforce the complex world we live in," she said. "We must provide people with the opportune means for participating in the decision-making according to their needs, which is most realistic at the local level.

Ms Leiva Diez outlined the key subjects of the Conference of European Ministers responsible for local and regional democracy, to be held in Valencia, Spain, on 15 and 16 October 2007 to focus on citizens' participation, good governance strategy and public ethics at local and regional level, advances in regional autonomy, and the launch of the European Week for Local Democracy.

This initiative, presented by Keith Whitmore, President of the Congress Institutional Committee, could be launched on 15 October, to mark the anniversary of the European Charter of Local Self-Government. The objective is to raise awareness of how local authorities operate and to draw the attention of European citizens to the fact that their participation in local affairs is crucial for the vitality of democracy.

A draft European Charter for Regional Democracy was presented by Jean-Claude Van Cauwenberghe, Rapporteur for the Congress Chamber of Regions. This text, after finalisation and adoption by the Congress in May 2008, could be submitted to the European Ministers responsible for local and regional democracy. The new draft takes account of all the developments in Europe over the last few years, particularly the irreversible assertion of the "regional phenomenon" in European policies.
