All different All Equal youth symposium focuses on integration for disabled young people

Strasbourg, 06.09.2007 – European youth campaigners are to focus on the issue of disability at a symposium in Mollina, Spain from the 12th to 16th September 2007 (Centro Eurolatinoamericano de Juventud, Avenida de América)

Entitled "Youth in the integration process of people with disabilities", the symposium is part of the [Council of Europe's All Different, All Equal Youth campaign](#). Organised in conjunction with the Spanish Youth Institute (INJUVE) and the Spanish Labour and Social Affairs Ministry, it will look for ways to better integrate young people with disabilities, reviewing new practices and regulatory frameworks, and fostering networks across borders. The aim will be to push for a strong commitment to equal opportunities for disabled young people and lobby governments to commit more money to removing obstacles in areas such as education, employment and mobility.

"All Different – All Equal" is a youth campaign in support of human rights, diversity, and participation.
