Strasbourg, 16.11.2007 - As part of the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities contribution to the Council of Europe's Dosta! campaign promoting Roma integration in Europe, the “Dosta!-Congress Prize for Municipalities” will be officially presented in Strasbourg (France) on Tuesday 20 November.

The prize has been awarded to three cities in south-east Europe: Vitez (Bosnia and Herzegovina), Banja Luka (Bosnia and Herzegovina) and Novi Sad (Serbia) in recognition of their commitment to promoting Roma political and social participation and combating discrimination. The prize highlights their work as examples of good practice.

The ceremony will take place in the Parliamentary Assembly lobby of the Palais de l'Europe at 12 noon, in the presence of Congress President Halvdan Skard, Deputy Secretary General Maud de Boer-Buquicchio and Council of Europe co-ordinator for Roma issues Henry Scicluna.

During the ceremony the Congress medal and a diploma will be presented to each of the three winners, which will be represented by Dragoljub Davidovic, Mayor of Banja Luka, Vlado Alilovic, Mayor of Vitez, and Snezana Mushitski, representing the City of Novi Sad.

There will also be the first public presentation of a CD produced for the Dosta! Campaign, “Music beyond prejudice, Romani variations on the European anthem”. The CD includes several pieces based on the European anthem and one will be performed at the ceremony by the “Queen of the Gypsies”, singer Esma Redzepova.

The awareness-raising campaign “Dosta! / Enough! Go beyond prejudice, discover the Roma” is part of a wider Council of Europe/European Commission project for Roma in South Eastern Europe, targeting Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Serbia, and « the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia ».
