PACE to observe parliamentary elections in Russia

Strasbourg, 23.11.2007 – The Bureau of the Council of Europe Parliamentary Assembly (PACE), meeting in Bratislava, yesterday confirmed that the Assembly will send a cross-party delegation of up to 55 parliamentarians, headed by Luc van den Brande (Belgium, EPP/CD), to observe the Duma elections in Russia on 2 December 2007.

"Our aim is to make a fair and impartial assessment of these elections, as for all member states subject to our monitoring procedure, and we look forward to working closely with fellow parliamentarians from the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly," said PACE President René van der Linden. Referring to ODIHR, he added: "I sincerely hope that it will reconsider its decision not to observe these elections."

The observers will begin meetings in Moscow on Thursday 29th November with electoral officials and representatives of the main parties running in the election, as well as the media and NGOs, before observing the vote in a representative sample of polling stations around the country, including in central Russia, Siberia and the Far East.

A nine-member PACE "pre-electoral" delegation issued a <u>statement</u> after visiting Moscow from 7 to 9 November to assess the run-up to the elections.

The heads of the PACE and OSCE Parliamentary Assembly delegations will hold a joint press conference to present their preliminary conclusions on Monday 3 December in Moscow (time and place to be confirmed)
