Open Days 2008: the Black Sea between co-operation and conflict

Strasbourg, 04.09.2008 - Are conflicts around the Black Sea area inevitable? Is there any conceivable future for co-operation among States, regions and towns around this Sea?

The Black Sea Basin is currently marked by the persistence of four "frozen conflicts", which represent a potential threat for the region itself and more broadly for the whole of Europe, namely Southern Ossetia, Abkhazia, Transnistria and Nagorno-Karabakh.

At the crossroads of Asia and Europe, the Black Sea Basin presents considerable potential for co-operation, but it remains an area of deep political division, which makes it particularly fragile.

The Round Table organised by the Council of Europe's Congress of Local and Regional Authorities as part of the Open Days of the EU Committee of the Regions will be considering the prospects for economic and cultural cooperation among the towns and regions of the Black Sea Basin, and will provide an opportunity for gauging the potential of such co-operation for blocking the dangerous mechanism of inter-State conflict.

Quentin Dickinson, journalist and Director of European Affairs with Radio France, will be chairing this debate, which will be attended by Ministers from States in the region and local and regional authority officials, as well as a number of experts on geopolitics.

The Round Table will kick off at 4.45 pm on Wednesday 8 October 2008 in Room JDE 52 (Committee of the Regions, "Jacques Delors" Building, Rue Belliard 99-101).
