Report on visit to Armenia

5 to 9 October 2014

Administration of justice

Positives

» on-going efforts in justice sector reform

» new legal provisions allow compensation for non-pecuniary damage in cases of miscarriage of justice and illegal actions of law enforcement bodies

» monitoring and cooperation activities by NGOs are taking place in relation to the army

» conscientious objectors are no longer prosecuted and imprisoned for refusing to perform military service

Recommendations

» strengthen judicial independence & self-governance

» review procedures for the selection, appointment, promotion and dismissal of judges & circumscribe the powers of the President of the Republic

» establish safeguards against arbitrary disciplinary proceedings

» allocate sufficient resources to the judiciary

Concerns

» persistent allegations about interference by senior courts and the executive in the work of lower-court judges

» widespread allegations and perception of corruption in the judiciary

» wide discretionary powers of the President in the procedures of selection, appointment, promotion & dismissal of judges

» reports about using disciplinary proceedings to influence or retaliate against judges

» low number of judges & increasing caseload of courts at all levels

» legacy of prosecutorial bias; equality of arms and adversarial proceedings are not guaranteed

» strong perceptions about selective justice

» cases of breach of the presumption of innocence

» excessive resort to & length of pretrial detention; lack of use of alternatives to detention

» persistent allegations about torture &

Criminal Code

» zero tolerance for cases of torture & ill-treatment

» enhance the independence of the Special Investigation Service and increase its capacity

» introduce recording of police interrogations & stronger safeguards against torture & ill-treatment

» proper training to increase use of physical evidence and reduce the reliance on confessions and information ill-treatment by law enforcement officials

» lack of effective investigations, which leads to impunity for serious human rights violations

» reports that coerced confessions are regularly used as evidence by courts

» non-combat deaths in the army

» no progress in ensuring accountability for 10 deaths during March 2008 events

obtained through questioning

» exclude using all evidence obtained under duress from court proceedings

» eliminate non-combat violence in the army & establish a Military Ombudsman

» duly implement the National Human Rights Action Plan in full cooperation with NGOs

» increase use of non-judicial mechanisms for the resolution of disputes

» investigate all allegations of corruption in the judiciary

» ensure the right to defence & access to legal aid during police custody, investigation and trial; uphold presumption of innocence

» develop alternative measures to detention & use pre-trial detention only in exceptional cases

» amend definition of torture in the

Women's rights and gender equality

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» increased discussion of the rights of women and gender equality

» adoption of action plans and policies on gender equality and to combat gender based violence

» adoption of the law on Equal Rights and Equal Opportunities for Women and Men

» increased efforts by the Police to provide gender-sensitive training and collect statistics

Concerns

» prevalence and seriousness of violence against women and domestic violence not fully acknowledged

» manifestations of social attitudes accepting or justifying violence against women » insufficient legal framework to combat violence against women and domestic violence

» low level of reporting and complaints regarding cases of domestic violence

» poor response from state institutions in cases of domestic violence » no comprehensive anti-discrimination law

» low participation of women in political and public decision-making; salary gap

» pre-natal sex-selection symptomatic of lower value society attaches to girls

Recommendations

» empower women & increase their participation in public & political life

» ensure that education system is free from gender bias & stereotypes

» adopt specific legislation against domestic violence

» improve identification, investigation & prosecution

of cases of violence against women

» increase data collection & strengthen training of police, investigators, prosecutors & judges

» amend law to allow investigation & prosecution of cases of violence against women even if the victim withdraws complaint

» ratify the Council of Europe

Convention on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence

» provide support to shelters for victims of domestic violence

» reinforce protection of human rights defenders; ensure that women's organisations can carry out their activities without intimidation or threats » take effective measures to address prenatal sex-selection
