Description: The 119th session of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe in Madrid will bring together ministers of Foreign Affairs and representatives of the 47 member states of the organisation.

During the meeting, which will commemorate the organisation's 60th anniversary, Spain will transfer the chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers to Slovenia, for the next six months.
