**Description:** A comprehensive overview about migration in Europe, its impact, benefits, scale and costs, and how to govern it to the benefit of home and host countries launched by the Council of Europe.

The book is prepared by a team of experts under guidance of the European Committee on Migration (CDMG).

It seeks to inform and persuade governments of the Council of Europe member states to put in place effective legislation, policies, institutions and practical measures to regulate migration and ensure rights protection and social cohesion at the national level.

## **Background information:**

More than 45 million foreign-born now live outside their countries of origin in the member states of the Council of Europe. About half of this number, some 22 million, are economically active; in other words employed, self-employed, self-employed or otherwise engaged in remunerative activity. They make huge contribution to economic development, well being, and productivity.

The book discusses the main challenges to strengthening the contributions migration makes to development, including return of skills, remittances, the "brain drain", the investment of migrants in countries of origin, co-development, and the role of diaspora.

It identifies main policy issues regarding equality of treatment and integration of migrant workers and their families and examines the specific policy factors to effectively regulate migration.
