Description: Racism and violence phenomena are taking more and more ground in sports nowadays. Last accident was on October 4th, in Bosnia and Herzegovina. One supporter was killed and 22 people injured in clashes before a match between Sarajevo and Siroki Brijeg. The international conference "Fight Against Racism and Violence through Diversity in Sport" aims at developing common strategies in order to propose measures to prevent those episodes. Strengthening education policies and fostering dialogue are at the core of the pan-European scope of the meeting.
