Drugs, medicines, alcohol and driving: experts debate European situation

Strasbourg, 05.07.2006 - The Council of Europe Pompidou Group (*) will organise on 10 and 11 July 2006 a seminar on Road Traffic and Drugs. The Seminar's aim will be the extensive exchange of ideas and information on the fundamental questions concerning road traffic and the consumption of psychoactives substances, including medicines and alcohol.

In particular, it will cover recent developments in European legislation, presentation of two major epidemiological studies and consideration of the role and impact of therapy programmes. A round table will also look at the practical needs of various professions in their day-to-day work.
