Congress: Michel Guégan concerned by the Flemish Minister's intransigence in the burgomasters' affair

Strasbourg, 09.04.2009 – "I am deeply concerned by the intransigence of Flemish Minister of Home Affairs Marino Keulen in the case of three non-appointed burgomasters," underlined today Michel Guégan (France, NR), Rapporteur on the situation of local democracy in Belgium of the Council of Europe Congress of Local and Regional Authorities.

In December 2008, the Congress held a debate on the non-appointment of elected burgomasters in three communities with special arrangements in the Flemish region. The debate followed a fact-finding mission to Brussels which found, in relation to the situation of burgomasters of Linkebeek, Kraainem/Crainhem and Wezembeek-Oppem, breaches of the European Charter of Local Self-Government, which has been ratified by Belgium. The Flemish Minister of Home Affairs, who had refused to appoint them as mayors, has just reiterated his refusal following the new request addressed to him on 1 April 2009. The Congress had recommended either to appoint the three mayors, or to proceed to new elections. In the present circumstances, the Congress Rapporteur continues to encourage the burgomasters to bring this matter before the competent judicial bodies.

"The expression of the people's will during elections is the very essence of democracy. Impeding elected representatives from fulfilling their duties, by denying them a formal appointment, makes this electoral exercise empty of all meaning, and this in violation of the Charter of Local Self-Government," said Michel Guégan.

"The Flemish authorities, since December 2008, have not taken into consideration the Congress' recommendation. By acting this way, they have deliberately reached a political impasse. The Congress will examine this matter again during its monitoring mission on the situation of local democracy in Belgium after the regional and European elections in June," he concluded.
