The Council of Europe Congress adopts partner for local democracy status

Strasbourg, 16.10.2014 – On 16 October 2014, at their 27th Session, the members of the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities of the Council of Europe adopted a resolution introducing "partner for local democracy" status open to local elected representatives in neighbouring non-member states of the Council of Europe.

Drawing on the "partner for democracy" status devised by the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe, which has already been granted to Morocco, Palestinie and Kyrgyzstan, this new status will allow such co-operation to be developed at the level of local and regional authorities, with a view to accompanying democratic reform in Europe's neighbouring regions, notably the Southern Mediterranean region.

The resolution stipulates that "partner for local democracy" status will be granted upon a joint request by the government of the requesting state and by one or more associations of local and/or regional elected representatives in that state. "This status commits the authorities to uphold, respect and promote at all levels of government the values and principles of the Council of Europe. It will constitute a formal framework for us to promote the initiation of a devolution process" said Jean-Claude Frécon, (France, SOC), rapporteur and newly elected President of the Congress.

Speaking on behalf of the Moroccan government during the debate, Hassan Bouhriz, deputy mayor of Tangiers and member of the House of Representatives and, underlined the importance of this co-operation with Europe for his country. "The democratic choice made by Morocco and by all of the country's political parties is an irreversible decision. It entails not only enjoyment of citizenship rights through properly conducted elections, but also the choice of the area in which these rights are exercised" he said. He also presented the next stages in Morocco's regionalisation project, which should be debated and adopted in 2015.

The Moroccan authorities should make a formal request to be granted "partner for local democracy" status in early 2015.
