he thematic programme "Strengthening institutional frameworks for local governance" is being implemented by the Council of Europe Centre of Expertise for Local Government Reform, Directorate General of Democracy, and the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities.

Funded by the European Union and the Council of Europe, this thematic programme is implemented by the Council of Europe through the Programmatic Cooperation Framework (PCF) for 2015-2017 for Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine and Belarus. The total budget of the programme is $\leq 2,570,000$.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- to support the on-going process of reform of local government in participating countries;
- ▶ to promote ethical behaviour by locally elected representatives of the region;
- to support the improvement of financial and human resources management of local administrations based on European standards and benchmarking processes.

EXPECTED RESULTS

- to improve the consistency of the legislative framework, streamlining new by-laws in at least three beneficiary countries and to develop targeted recommendations;
- to foster a more efficient, transparent and ethical governance at the local level in at least three beneficiary countries;
- ▶ to develop and adapt the standard European local finance benchmarking tool to the specific countries so as to improve legislation and local regulations.
