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Reforms of territorial governance

- Common problems:
 - Finances and budget cuts
 - EU membership: cohesion policies and stability pact
- Declared aim: improving efficiency!
- Differentiation:
 - Categories of States
 - Regional and local levels
- Balance: guarantees change

Areas of intervention: Regional level

• Status:

protection through entrenchment and/or bilateral relations

- Competencies (and finances): guarantees and flexibility
- Boundaries: entrenched procedures
- Participation and relations between levels of government:
 - institutions and procedures
 - Courts

Change 2007-2015? Regional level

- Little change: Albania, Bosnia, Croatia, Denmark, Finland, Georgia, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal (mainland), Romania, Slovakia, Sweden
- Recentralisation: Hungary, Serbia, Ukraine
- Experimentation: Greece, Ireland, France, Sweden, Russia
- Minor change in strong regions: Austria, Germany, Italy, Portugal (Azores, Madeira), Spain, Switzerland
- Substantial change: Belgium, UK
- Non-regionalized countries

Areas of intervention: local authorities

- Major local government reforms in a number of countries
- Constitutional or legal entrenchment of LSG
- "Rationalization" affects status, boundaries or competencies:

 a) amalgamation, merger (Denmark, Ireland, Albania, Greece)
 b) intermunicipal cooperation by association (Spain, France, Italy)
- Other issues:
 - Adequacy between powers and financial resources
 - Right to property

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Conclusive remarks

- Trends:
 - More differentiation between weak and strong Regions
 - Pressure on intermediate tier
 - Rationalisation at municipal level
- But: different models different recipes!
- Recommendations for reform procedure:
 - 1. Legal certainty and transparency: legal or constitutional entrenchment
 - 2. Inclusive reform? Consultation and participation!
