PACE debate on illicit trafficking in human organs in Kosovo (*) set for Tuesday morning

Strasbourg, 24.01.2011 – Following the adoption of its agenda this morning, the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE) will debate the report by Dick Marty (Switzerland, ALDE) on "Inhuman treatment of people and illicit trafficking in human organs in Kosovo" on Tuesday 25 January at 10 a.m., instead of at 3 p.m. as originally foreseen.

The vote should take place around 4 p.m, and Mr Marty will give a press conference at 4.30 p.m. (Room 1, Palais de l'Europe) along with Jean-Charles Gardetto (Monaco, EPP/CD), rapporteur on "The protection of witnesses as a cornerstone for justice and reconciliation in the Balkans" and Christos Pourgourides (Cyprus, EPP/CD), Chairperson of the Assembly's Committee on Legal Affairs and Human Rights.
