Harmonisation between lists of species targeted by Resolution 6 (1998) of the Bern Convention, Annex I of the Birds Directive and Annex II of the Habitats Directive

Background

When adopting Resolution 3 (1996) of the Bern Convention which encourages Contracting Parties to set up a pan- European Ecological Network, and Resolution No 5 (1998), concerning the rules for the Network of Areas of Special Conservation Interest (ASCIs) under the Emerald Network, Parties to the Bern Convention aimed at ensuring maximum consistency between the Emerald and the EU Natura 2000 approaches. Resolution 5 (1998) further states that "for Contracting Parties which are Member States of the European Union, Emerald Network sites are those of the Natura 2000". One of the basic aims was that the Emerald approach should help EU candidate countries to prepare for the Natura 2000 process.

It is thus crucial that the list of species for which Contracting Parties are encouraged to designate ASCIs – therefore listed in Resolution 6 of the Bern Convention - is as consistent as possible with the list of species for which EU Member States have to designate Special Protection Areas (SPAs) under Annex I of the Birds Directive and propose Sites of Community Interest (SCIs) for further designation as Special Areas of Conservation (SACs) under Annex II of the Habitat Directive, as part of the Natura 2000 network.

Due to the successive enlargements of the European Union (1995, 2004 and 2007), the list of species for which Member States have to designate Natura 2000 sites has grown over time to take into account the new ecological context and characteristics of the new countries. Resolution 6 of the Bern Convention has not followed this evolution, although some species were identified as 'candidate species'.

The present document aims at highlighting the changes needed in Resolution 6 of the Bern Convention, to be consistent with the relevant annexes of the Birds and the Habitats Directives. It is worth underlying that a similar exercise will be developed between the lists of habitats targeted by Resolution 4 (1996) of the Bern Convention and the Annex I of the Habitats Directive in the near future.

Procedure for harmonisation of species lists

Following a request by the Council of Europe Secretariat, and as part of the Memorandum of Cooperation between the Council of Europe and the European Environment Agency, the European Topic Centre on Biological Diversity (ETC/BD) has performed a comparative analysis of the current list of species under Resolution 6 of the Bern Convention and respectively Annex I of the Birds Directive and Annex II of the Habitats Directive.

For the purpose, the ETC/BD compared the most recently updated Resolution 6 of the Bern Convention with the list of species added to Annex I of the Birds Directive and Annex II of the Habitat Directive due to the enlargement process. In addition, the ETC/BD looked at the correspondence between the species listed under the two EU Directives, currently not listed in Resolution 6 and the list of species targeted by Appendices I, II and III of the Bern Convention. The purpose of this analysis is to highlight on which species – to be possibly added - the Contracting Parties of the Bern Convention already have a commitment under this instrument.

The results of the analysis are summarised below. Details of the analysis are available in a separate x-cel format table.

Results of the comparative analysis

- **929 taxa** are currently listed both in the EU Nature Directives (Annex II of the Habitats Directive and Annex I of the Birds Directive) and in the Bern Convention Resolution 6 (including 11 « candidates »).
- To align Resolution 6 with relevant annexes of the EU Nature Directives, ETC/BD identified **156 taxa to be added**, out of which 4 need a further look (e.g for taxonomical reason, geographical distribution): *Oenanthe pleschanka (Bird), Vipera ursinii rakosiensis* (Reptile), *Crambe tataria* (Plant) *Poa granitica ssp. disparilis* (Plant).
- 191 taxa (including 56 « candidates ») are only covered by Resolution 6 and not by the EU Nature Directives. Eight of them need a further look (e.g for taxonomical reason, geographical reason,...): Pseudophoxinus marathonicus, Pseudophoxinus stymphalicus, Chondrostoma lemingi, Padogobius panizzai, Leucaspius stymphalicus, Cobitis aurata (Fish species), Poa granitica, and Crambe litwinonowii (Plants).
- In addition to the above-mentioned issues, a number of other taxonomic problems are presented below. They remain to be solved before finalising the alignment of Resolution 6 with relevant annexes of the EU Nature Directives.
